Hernando County CDBG Public Services

- Funding is allocated annually to develop viable communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and opportunities to expand economic opportunities, principally for low-to-moderate income persons within the unincorporated area of Hernando County.

Three-Year Consolidated Plan

- Broad goals and priorities
- Data gathering analysis
- Guides how funding will be invested in our community

Annual Action plan

Provides a summary of actions, activities, and resources planned for each year to address the priority needs and meet the goals identified in the Consolidated plan

Community Outreach/Input

Helps identify and prioritize needs, goals, and funding investments for project categories.

Hernando County CDBG Public Services

- The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development provides support for housing and community activities.

*****Public Services applications/awards are contingent upon the County's CDBG allocation from HUD*****

- Entitlement grantees cannot obligate more than more than 15% of their total allocation to support nonprofit organizations in the community.

National Objectives

Area Benefit:

The activity serves all residents of an area where at least 51 percent of the residents are LMI. The area must be clearly delineated by the state and must be primarily residential.

Limited Clientele:

The activity provides services to specific groups of LMI persons

51% of clients served must be LMI, those who earn 80% or below of the area median income

Eligibility requirements will apply

Serve a group presumed to be LMI such as abuse children, battered spouses, elderly person, severely disabled adults, homeless person, person living with AIDS and migrant farm workers.

Be of such a nature and in a location that may be concluded that the activity's clientele are LMI

Who Can Apply

Nonprofit organizations (IRS designation)

Faith-based organization without any requirements around religious beliefs or practices

Good Standing with the State

Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) + registration on SAM.gov

Not Suspended or Barred from receiving federal funds

Who CANNOT APPLY

Individuals

For-profit business

Organization that are funders/pass-through entities

Are not the primary service provider

Requires religious engagement/influence

Engage in discriminatory practices.

Funding Requirement/Activities – What Can Be Done

Eligible Public Service Activities

- CDBG Public Services eligible activities:
 - Employment services (job training)
 - Crime prevention & public safety
 - Childcare
 - Health services/Mental Health
 - Substance abuse services (counseling/treatment)
 - Fair housing counseling
 - Education programs
 - Energy conservation
 - Services for seniors
 - Services for homeless persons
 - Recreation programs

Eligible Public Service Activities – Targeted Groups

- Targeted Group Examples:
 - Children (0-12)
 - Youth (12-19)
 - Elderly
 - Homeless/At risk of homelessness
 - Individuals with disabilities
 - Individuals with HIV/AIDS
 - Veterans

Clients can live anywhere in Hernando County or in a specific neighborhood.

Services cannot be limited to tenant of one facility/building. Example: Only residents of one senior living facility.

Ineligible Public Service Activities

- CDBG Public Services ineligible activities:
 - Political activities
 - Payments directly to individuals
 - Temporary housing/pass through leasing
 - Equipment, maintenance and repairs, facility operating costs,
 - Fundraising
 - Government expenses/building
 - Funding for activities already provided by a city or state, ongoing funding for county services



COMPLIANCE

Funding Requirements

Eligibility Basics



Eligible proposers must be a 501(c)(3) non-profit.

CDBG funds may be used to pay for labor, supplies, and material as well as to operate and/or maintain the portion of a facility in which the public service is located. This includes the lease of a facility, equipment, and other property needed for the public service.

Funding must be used for activities and residents within the unincorporated areas of Hernando County.




